SENIOR PASS PROGRAM



THEIR DATA AND PRESENT THEIR FINDINGS.





WIN BLOCK: WHAT I NEED

WIN BLOCK IS A 30 MINUTE OPPORTUNITY BLOCK THAT STUDENTS HAVE IN THEIR SCHEDULE EACH DAY. WIN BLOCK IS USED FOR MANY PURPOSES INCLUDING:

ADVISORY

PROGRAM WHERE THEY HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO TALK ABOUT SOCIAL SKILLS AND BUILD RELATIONSHIPS. WE USE A CURRICULUM CALLSED "CHARACTER STRONG."

EXTRA HELP

MANY STUDENTS USE THIS TIME TO GET EXTRA HELP FROM A TEACHER. THEY MAY PREPARE FOR AN ASSESSMENT, MAKE UP MISSED WORK, OR DIVE MORE DEEPLY INTO THE CONTENT. STUDENTS ALSO HAVE ACCESS TO OUR LIBRARY DURING THIS TIME.

WORKSHOPS AND MEETINGS

INSTEAD OF PULLING STUDENTS FROM CLASS, WE USE THIS BLOCK
TO HOLD IMPORTANT MEETINGS AND HOST WORKSHOPS
WITHOUTSIDE COMMUNITY MEMBERS.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER PROGRAM (SRO)




PACT
