Present at 7:00 p.m. were Debra LaValley Bibeau, Stanley Schwartz, Bonnie Schultz, Gale Hanshaw, Tom McGee, Ann Connolly King, David Jack, Superintendent of Schools and Courtney Ouellet, SAC Representative. (Absent: Thatcher Kezer)

The Vice Chair called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Stanley Schwartz.

II. PRESENTATIONS

1. School Improvement Plan – Amesbury Elementary School

Mr. Helliesen, AES Principal, gave a PowerPoint presentation regarding his school's improvement plan followed by a question and answer period.

2. School Improvement Plan – Amesbury Middle School

Mr. Curry, AMS Principal, also gave a PowerPoint presentation regarding his school's improvement plan. This presentation was followed by a question and answer period with the school committee.

III. COMMENTS BY VISITORS, DELEGATIONS

IV. <u>ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS</u>

A. Curriculum Director's Report

Ms. Imel spoke about the Title I program and how it works in the Amesbury Public Schools. She was asked to explain what Title I provides. She explained that Title I is for those students targeted as being "at risk" in English and/or Math. The students that qualify are not necessarily those in a low income status. Title I funding is based on academic needs. It provides students in grades K-4 extra time to learn. The Title I Extended Day Program will run from October to May.

Ms. Imel handed out the list of workshops that teachers attended during the October 8th Professional Development Day. There was some X2 grade book training, bullying work as well as consumerism. The school committee asked if every teacher has their own web page that can be accessed from the outside. Telena explained that some teachers have web pages and some are just getting the training. Some teachers have areas of their web pages that are password protected when necessary.

Telena also reminded the committee that AEFI's next fundraiser is Monday, October 25th. For tickets call Carol Bartlett.

B. Business Administrator's Report

Mr. Bergeron gave an update on the quarterly report as a follow-up to his report at the last school committee meeting. He said that there is now a budget freeze in place. The school department will hold off on any large purchases. The revenue received in the transportation area has increased and is expected to reach the target. Circuit Breaker monies are projected to be a higher amount that expected. It is too early in the year to report on Choice monies. It appears that the food services area will see an increase in revenues compared to last year. The high school's free and reduced numbers have increased.

Mr. Bergeron and Ms. Glennon are working on a spreadsheet that will show where the funds come from for each of our special needs students. The South Hampton numbers are lower due to a small freshman class.

C. Superintendent's Report

Mr. Jack explained how students qualify for the John and Abigail Adams state scholarships and then read the names of the Amesbury students who qualified for the scholarship. He also read the names of the five students who were inducted into the National Honor Society.

Superintendent's Goals 2010-2011

Mr. Jack made the school committee goals his goals as well. He also added four additional goals that the school committee will vote on at the November 1st school committee meeting.

Mr. Jack will have a regular spot on local radio station WNBP where he will speak about topics concerning the Amesbury Public Schools that the general public will be interested in hearing about. He will be talking about the Race To The Top tomorrow morning at 7:30 a.m.
