COMMUNITY

Amesbury is a residential community of 17,560 people. It is located in the northeastern corner of Massachusetts on the New Hampshire border, 40 miles north of Boston.

SCHOOL

Amesbury High School is a four-year secondary school with a student population of 450 for the 2023-2024 school year. The academic program operates on a six-period day of 55-minute periods. Amesbury High School is accredited by the New England Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges.

The school has 20 varsity teams that have successfully competed at both the local and state levels. Co-curricular activities include a music and performing arts program, service organizations, school publications, academic activities, honor societies, clubs, and student government.

CURRICULUM

Amesbury High School's Class of 2024 must earn a minimum of eighty-four credits and complete 45 hours of Community Service to be eligible to graduate. Required content credit shown below. Courses are valued at 1 credit per quarter.

DUAL ENROLLMENT OPPORTUNITIES

There is a Dual Enrollment partnership between Amesbury High School and Northern Essex Community College. The courses are taught by Northern Essex professors.

Southern New Hampshire University in the High School is a Dual Enrollment program in partnership with SNHU. The courses are taught by AHS teachers.

GPA CALCULATION

Beginning with the Class of 2021, class rank is no longer determined. GPA will continue to be based on weighted grades. GPA is cumulative for all academic courses taken during the school year, beginning with grade 9. Based on the difficulty of the subject content, courses are assigned a level of College Preparatory (CP), Honors (H), or Advanced Placement (AP). Pass/Fail courses are not included.

GPA shown on the transcript does not include the current school year.

COVID ADJUSTMENTS

For the 2020-2021 school year, no grade modifications were made. While the year began with remote live instruction four days a week, by the start of fourth quarter the learning model had transitioned back to in person instruction five days a week.
